

Certificate Qualification

The CILA Certificate is an entry level qualification which is open to any member of the Institute. Successful attainment of this qualification will provide you with an excellent foundation in claims handling and will also allow you to progress to the CILA Diploma exams.

In attaining the CILA Certificate qualification you will also hold an Edexcel BTEC Level 3 Certificate in Insurance Claims Handling (QCF). The CILA Certificate is recognised on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) at Level 3.

What will I learn?



CH1:

Introduction to the Insurance Industry

Risk and risk transfer, parties in the insurance industry, contract law, legal liability, insurable interest, fair presentation, indemnity, proximate cause, contribution, subrogation, customer service and regulation of the insurance market.



CH2:

Claims Handling

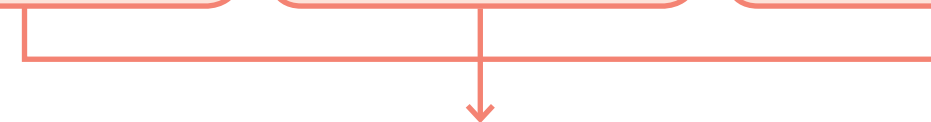
Elements of an insurance policy including policy conditions and warranties, definitions of the insurance perils with supporting case law, claims validation, mitigation of losses, reasonable care, gradually operating cause, underinsurance, repudiations and fraud.



CH3:

Advanced Claims Handling (Handling Claims for Specific Losses)

Basics of business interruption, alternative accommodation claims, basic building elements, common buildings damage, Construction (Design & Management) Regulations, catastrophe or surge claims handling, reserving for personal injury claims and an overview of the Civil Procedure Rules.

1. CILA membership
